HOUSEHOLD HAZARDOUS WASTE

Guidelines, Safety and Transport: Do not bring items in black plastic bags!

All containers must be sealed and have a lid or cap. Never mix chemicals. Products should be in original containers. If the original container is leaking, transfer to a different container and label properly. No containers over 5 gallons accepted.

Reminder! Boulder Facility Accepts HHW Year-Round

Broomfield residents can take their household hazardous wastes to the Boulder County Hazardous Materials Management Facility (HMMF) year-round!

ITEMS NOT ACCEPTED:

- Solidified latex paint (remove lid and place in trash)
- Ammunition, explosives, flares, fireworks (contact local law enforcement or North Metro Fire District at 303.452.9910)
- Asbestos-containing insulation, tile, brake pads, linoleum, and heat pads (Contact CDPHE, emailcdphe.information@state.co.us or phone 303.692.2000)
- Propane tanks from barbeque grills (Clark's or Fred's propane services, click [HERE](#) for link)
- Business wastes ([Boulder County HMMF](#) accepts by appointment only)
- Empty containers (remove lid and place in trash)
- Fire extinguishers (accepted at [CHaRM](#) facility in Boulder)
- Halogen and incandescent bulbs
- Medical wastes, prescription drugs (drop-box at [7 DesCombes Dr.](#))
- Non-hazardous wastes (trash)
- Radioactive materials (Contact CDPHE, emailcdphe.information@state.co.us or phone 303.692.2000)
- Red helium tank ([Boulder County HMMF](#))
- Smoke and carbon monoxide detectors (trash or contact manufacturer)
- X-Rays (Trash)

ACCEPTABLE ITEMS INCLUDE:

- Abrasive cleaners
- Aerosols
- Alkaline batteries
- Ammonia-based cleaners
- Antifreeze

- Batteries (alkaline, lithium, lead-acid, rechargeable, button cells)
- Battery-powered toothbrush (remove battery, plastic housing goes in trash)
- Bleach
- Brake fluid
- Car wax and cleaners
- Caulk
- Degreasers
- Deodorizers
- Disinfectants
- Floor cleaners/wax
- Fluorescent light tubes/compact fluorescent light bulbs, LEDs, UV Bulbs, Projector Lamps, HID Bulbs and any other mercury-containing bulbs. (If broken just trash)
- Fertilizers
- Freon
- Fungicides
- Furniture polish
- Fuels (diesel/gas/kerosene)
- Flea control products
- Insecticides
- Mineral spirits
- Mothballs
- Nail polish (and remover)
- Needles, sharps ([Boulder County HMMF](#) accepts in approved container)
- Oven cleaners
- Paint, paint thinners & strippers (40 gallons Max. Please visit [Paintcare.org](#) for additional drop-off locations)
- Pesticides
- Photographic chemicals
- Pool/spa chemicals
- Propane tanks (small camping size ONLY)
- Resins (fiberglass & epoxy)
- Rug & upholstery cleaners
- Rust removers
- Silver cleaners
- Soil fumigants
- Thermometers and liquid mercury
- Drain cleaners
- Transmission fluid
- Vape waste (e-liquid and batteries only - no marijuana)
- Varnishes
- Weed killers
- White gas (camping stove fuel)
