- BREWHAHA is Saturday, June 13, 2026
- Festival hours: 12 p.m.-5 p.m., rain or shine
- Location: Arista Park at 8001 Arista Place, Broomfield
- This event is free and open to all ages. Everyone will be age-verified at the gates and given an appropriate wristband.
- Vendor registration is completed online at B-REx.com. Search for BrewHaha Vendor or Food Vendor to start your application.
- We request products/services be focused on appealing to young professionals and fit a modern lifestyle.
- BREWHAHA attendance estimate is 2500 adults and 250 teens and young adults.
- Set up: 9:00 - 11:00 a.m. The street closes to vehicles at 11 a.m.
- Tear down: Street reopens at 5 p.m. for move out
- Plan to staff your booth for the entire festival.
- Each vendor is allotted a 10 'x 10' booth space on the street.
- Provide your own 10' x 10' canopy, weights for tent legs (tents are on the street so no stakes) tables, and chairs.
- Electricity is available along the street, bring your own extension cord and duct tape to safely secure the power cord across walkways. *No generators, please.*
- BREWHAHA is a zero-waste event so please carefully consider your giveaways and encourage proper disposal. Zero waste event and guidelines are attached and your signature below means you will abide by these guidelines.

100% Zero Waste Participation Agreement

Dear Vendor:

Thank you for your interest in participating at BREWHAHA! We are proud to announce that this event will be a Zero Waste event.

The goal at a Zero Waste event is to plan ahead and distribute only materials that are recyclable (not any materials that will be landfilled). “Zero Waste Stations” consisting of recycling bins will be available to participants at numerous locations throughout the park. As a vendor handing out products at this event, you play a vital part in the success of our Zero Waste initiative.

Vendors attending BREWHAHA are required to hand out only recyclable, reusable materials to the public. We have included local recycling guidelines with this contract so you know which types of materials will be acceptable to distribute.

Remember, if an item is not recyclable locally, we cannot recycle it, even if your supplier has told you it can be recycled. If you have any questions as to whether your items are considered recyclable or compostable, please contact Jenny Morgan at 303-464-5506 or jbmorgan@broomfield.org. We will answer your questions and help you understand your important role in this Zero Waste event. Please note that you will be asked to remove any non-recyclable items from your booth for the duration of the event. You will only be allowed to distribute recyclable products.

Your signature on the vendor application acknowledges that you will abide by all Zero Waste guidelines and requirements. We look forward to working with you to make this a successful Zero Waste event.

Our Zero Waste goal is simple to attain if you plan ahead of time the kinds of materials you will be providing to the public at the event. Here are some ideas that can help you achieve this goal:

Use the least amount of packaging possible or remove the packaging before distributing the item.

Use paper ‘goodie’ bags rather than plastic bags.

Use post-consumer (preferred) or recycled content for flyers, programs and handouts. Choose to print on paper with the highest recycled content possible.

Do not use “neon” fluorescent or dark-colored papers. These cannot be recycled.

Do not use kraft or goldenrod (orange-brownish envelopes)

Candy wrappers, energy bars, chip bags and packaging from pre-packaged food are trash items.

For Local Sources for Recycled Paper, contact local office paper supply stores. For paper bags, make sure they are not coated with plastic. Lunch paper bags are cost effective and can be recycled.



Guidelines for Containers and Service Ware for Zero Waste Events

Acceptable Items - YES!	Not Acceptable Items - NO
All paper containers including plates, bowls, cups, etc. These items must not have any plastic coating on them.	Styrofoam (polystyrene). It is not recyclable, regardless of what your suppliers may tell you and despite any recycling symbols on the product.
Paper lids or starch based lids. These items must not have plastic coating on them.	No plastic lids without the recycling chasing arrows and associated numbers.
Paper milk cartons and drink boxes	No foil drink pouches
Compostable containers, dishware and utensils made from plant starches that have the compostable label	No fast food cups, paper packages or containers, plastic cutlery, or small deli cups (used for salsa or syrup)
Plastic bottles and Jugs # 1-7 (no lids)	No plastic bags of any kind
Glass bottles and jars	No straws
Plastic tubs and screw top jars # 1-7	No twist ties, twine or plastic rope
Paper napkins and paper towels	No candy wrappers
Waxed coated cardboard boxes such as frozen hot dog or hamburger boxes	No individual chip packages, individual condiment packages
Aluminum foil and cans (do not crush cans)	No Frozen food packaging
Metal jar lids and steel bottle caps	No plastic coated paper products
Brown paper bags and corrugated cardboard	No Wax paper

All recyclable plastic must have the following chasing arrow symbol on the container:



All compostable containers must have the following label on the container:
